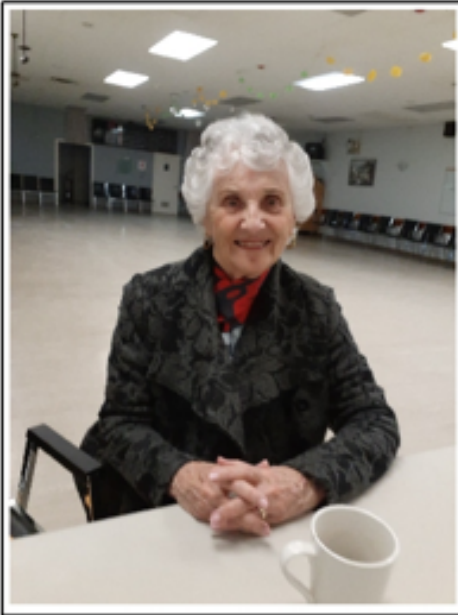

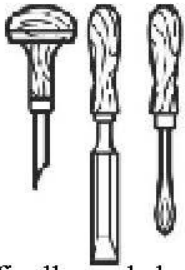

## COWICHAN CARVERS - Thursdays, 11am

This very busy group was started back in 2003 after a few of them had been to a local course at Duncan College to learn more about wood carving by hand.. When the course was finished, ten of the group decided to form a club to meet each week to carve. After trying out several venues they finally ended up at the Valley Seniors Organization and have now expanded to a group of 20 members, and for nearly 20 years they've met each week in the Craft Room, and even stay for lunch utilizing the menu of our friendly kitchen.

The carvers each work on their own individual projects which range from Love Spoons, wall hangings, Christmas tree ornaments, birds, toothpick holder, eagle plaque and a relief carving, to mention just a few. I was interested in the different woods that are used, some of which I'd never heard of before. For example Buss wood, from the Linden tree which can be obtained locally. They carve with red cedar, yellow cedar, butternut wood, maple and several others.

I asked about arbutus wood as I know it's a very dense wood, but apparently it tends to be brittle and can bend out of shape once carved.

They usually start with drawing a picture on the block of wood roughly of what they want their project to be.. There are many tools which are used including chisels, gougers, vee tools, which come in various sizes and angles. Some carvers have large carving tool sets which even include wood burning kits. These pyrography kits are used for burning designs and decorations into the wood, which gives it a different effect. Some of the projects are also stained or painted once finished.

Each year the carvers enter into the art category of the Brant Wildlife Festival in Parksville/Qualicum, and have won several prizes over the years, with Cathy, a new member, winning this year for a native style spoon. Liz said all the carvers get along really well together, and help out any new members if they need it. I can vouch for their friendliness, and found this activity to be so relaxing as each person seemed so happy displaying their inner talents and creativity, whilst quietly carving.

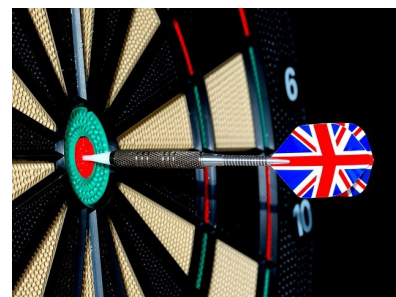
On April 19th Lil was the champion of all three games as she doubled out and won each game for her team. Whoo Hoo Lil.

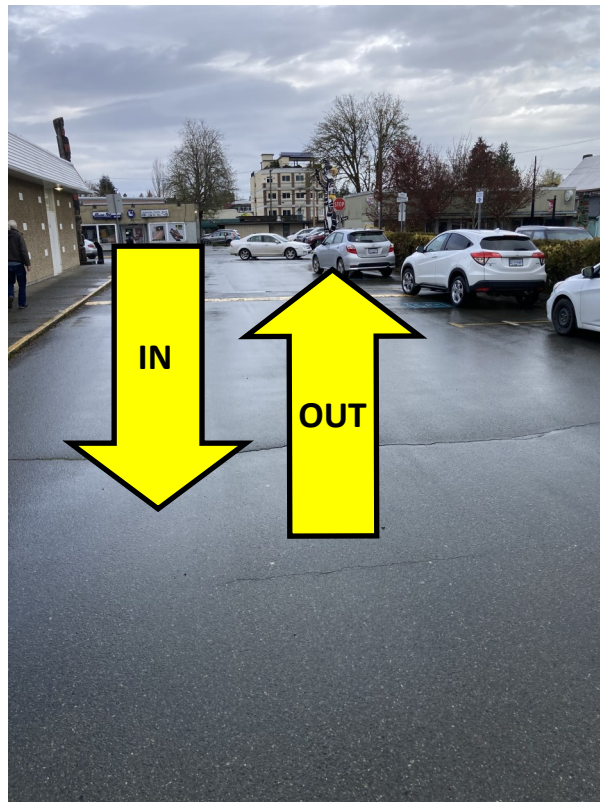
